Re: Annual Notification of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) Program – Lenawee Intermediate School District

The Lenawee Intermediate School District has inspected and tested each of its school facilities for the presence of Asbestos Containing Materials. Materials used in construction, remodeling, or renovation, which contain asbestos, are known as Asbestos Containing Building Materials (ACBM). Federal Law requires the school district to inspect, test, and identify known or suspected ACBM. Additionally, the law requires that the Lenawee Intermediate School District prepare Management Plans for each facility. These Management Plans contain information regarding:

- the location, quantity, and type of Asbestos Containing Material or suspected Asbestos Containing Material
- the school district's plan for assuring that these materials do not pose a health threat to those persons utilizing the school buildings
- a record of any subsequent abatement work, complete with names of those who performed the work, inspected the work and performed air monitoring tests with results

Also, records of subsequent inspections and periodic surveillance inspections can be found in the Management Plan. Each school facility is surveyed every six months to inspect the condition of ACBM to ensure that they have not been disturbed. Every three years the school is thoroughly inspected by Environmental Protection Agency accredited inspectors who not only inspect the condition of ACBM but also reassess the operation and maintenance procedures and amends the action plan to reflect any change in condition of ACBM.

In accordance with Federal law the Management Plan for each of Lenawee Intermediate School District's facilities is available for inspection by any interested party during regular school office hours, Monday through Friday.
